Homework is designed to provide a link between home and school. We believe it encourages children to realise that learning can take place outside the classroom as well as promoting independent learning thus encouraging the child to take great responsibility for their personal progress. Homework allows parents, carers and the school, to work in partnership for the benefit of their child.

AIMS

Homework is set for all children attending Ramridge Primary for the following reasons:

- To develop personal organisation skills
- To involve parents and carers in the learning process of their child/children
- To consolidate, reinforce and supplement learning at school
- To greatly add to study time available throughout a school career
- To develop a positive attitude to learning as a life skill rather than just a school-based activity
- To develop independent learning skills
- To prepare them for the next stage in their education

ORGANISATION

Each homework assignment is focused on developing core skills and ensuring that children have the opportunity to practice these skills. It reinforces and extends the teaching and learning that occurs during the day/ week. The table below shows our expectations:

When setting assignments, account should be taken of the child's ability. Children should be encouraged to discuss any problems they are having with their teacher. Any home learning completed will be acknowledged by a member of the class team.

While all pupils in school will be encouraged to complete home learning tasks set, there will be an expectation that all pupils in Year 5 and Year 6 **must** complete tasks set. This is due to the nature of the work set and its links to work around SATs and also to prepare pupils for what will be expected of them as they transfer to high school.
